beverley park residential services



Beverley Park Residential Service provides long-term supported accommodation for people with physical disabilities and high support needs. The service is located in Campbelltown.

Accommodation

Residents live in four purpose-built villa units with their own gardens and outdoor living areas. Each unit is shared by four people. The units are spacious and fully wheelchair accessible, with communication systems and other adaptations for people who have high physical support needs.

Supported Living

Day-to-day support services are organised in response to residents' needs and choices. Residential support workers provide the practical help that people require with activities of daily living such as showering, dressing and housework. Residents use health care services in the community.

People who live at Beverley Park manage their lives as independently as possible. Individual service planning is available and can cover major areas of life such

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as health and fitness, education, vocational training, recreation and future accommodation. Family members, advocates and guardians may be involved with the resident and the staff in the planning process and putting the plans into action.

Residents are involved in work, further education, recreation, and social activities in the Campbelltown area. Beverley Park can offer some staff support and transport to assist residents to participate in activities.

Eligibility

Applicants for Beverley Park must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- They are adults who have physical disabilities. The primary target group is people whose disabilities originated prior to adulthood
- They require a supported accommodation service with twenty-four hour staffing
- They do not require specialised care as a result of psychiatric illness, serious medical conditions or major intellectual disabilities.

Cost

Beverley Park residents pay board which is set at a fixed proportion of income and covers rent, food and utility charges. Residents pay their own telephone bills.

Funding

The service is funded by the Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care and Northcott Disability Services.
